SUMMER SUMMARY

What an eventful summer it has been at the Library! Where else could you experience encounters with snakes, jugglers, sewing machines, foam parties, free lunches, and enjoy Bursting Bubble Adventure Drinks? The theme for summer 2024 was "Adventure Begins at Your Library," and we certainly organized numerous exciting adventures this year.

- **233** readers signed up for Kindergarten-12th grade programs
- **35** registered for Preschool programs
- **41** adults joined the Reading Challenge
- **5,619** library items were checked out this summer



The Library hosted a total of **24** summer adventure programs with an impressive attendance of **849** participants!

The Gather2Grow lunches, in collaboration with Feeding America West Michigan and many private donors, were a hit. The Lake Odessa Community Library served **1,608** lunches this summer!

Mr. Mike made weekly visits to Jordan Lake Beach every Friday in July, engaging with **59** kids and **27** adults, teaching the science and art of skipping rocks, launching air rockets, and cooking with solar cookers.

Sewing classes were also popular with **241** projects completed and an average of **50** sewists diligently working every Tuesday in July.

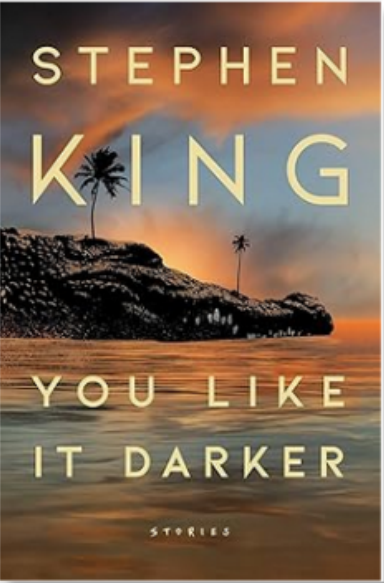

You Like It Darker by Stephen King

King's latest release is a gem of a book filled with both short stories and novellas. The works included are diverse and engrossing, captivating any true horror fan. Danny Coughlin's Bad Dream is about a man who tries to report a murder recounted during a psychic dream, only to become the main suspect. On Slide Inn Road is a southern gothic homage to Flannery O'Connor and recounts when a family drive goes wrong. One of the final tales is called Rattlesnake, about undead twins haunting Vic Trenton, a character first introduced in King's 1981 novel Cujo. King remains on top of his game with this new collection. His sense of suspense and terror is unmatched. (all formats available)



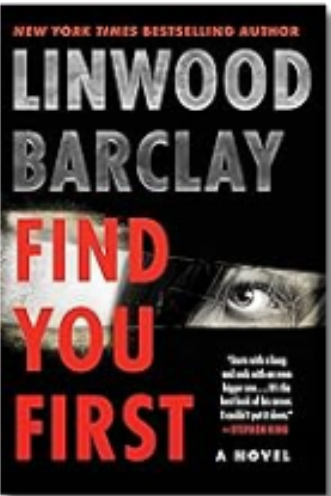
Wolf at the Table by Adam Rapp

This sizable book (over 400 pages) follows the Larkin family's five siblings through childhood in the 1950's until the early 2000's. The characters maintain a frightening proximity to violence as seen through close brushes with famous figures John Wayne Gacy and Richard Speck. Larkin brother, Alec harbors secrets of his own that prove to be as violent and grim as any exacted by those killers. Rapp does an excellent job of showing how the loyalty and love that bind family members together often blind them to the evil in their midst. (hardcover, eBook, audiobook)



Find You First by Linwood Barclay

Barclay's novel follows Miles, a tech billionaire suffering from a terminal illness. He begins a quest to find biological children he never knew he had via a sperm bank over 20 years ago. Hoping to locate these individuals and claim them as his heirs, Miles is joined in his journey by one of the children, Chloe. One by one the unwitting descendants are being killed and it is up to Miles and Chloe to find out who the killer is and why they are on this dark path. Barclay's book is fast paced and the twist toward the end will surprise you. (all formats available)

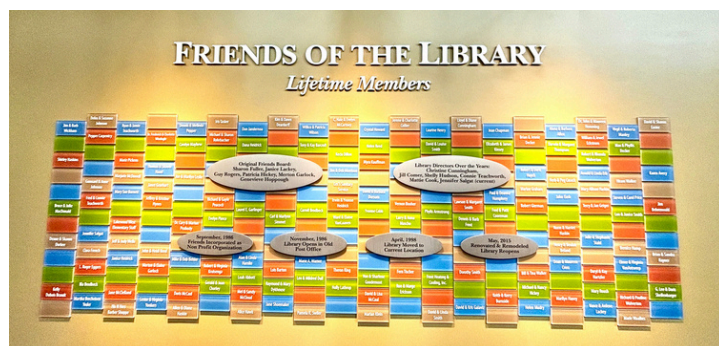




Friends of the Library UPDATES

LIFETIME MEMBERSHIPS

The Friends group uses our newsletter to keep the community updated and engaged about the Library and Friends programs and events, and recap past ones. We also include a form on the back for those wanting to become Lifetime Friends Members or support our organization through a donation. Newsletters are printed and mailed several times each year and also may be sent via email. **We encourage you to receive our newsletters electronically** as postage increased to \$.73 in July 2024.



Lifetime Members are recognized on a beautiful display adjacent to the entrance to the meeting rooms. This display is updated annually in January with new lifetime members from the previous calendar year. The donation for Lifetime Memberships and Annual Memberships was set in 1986. Our Friends group recently voted to increase the one-time Lifetime Membership Donation to \$150 effective January 1, 2025. At the same time, Annual Memberships are being eliminated and a Donation line added to the newsletter form.

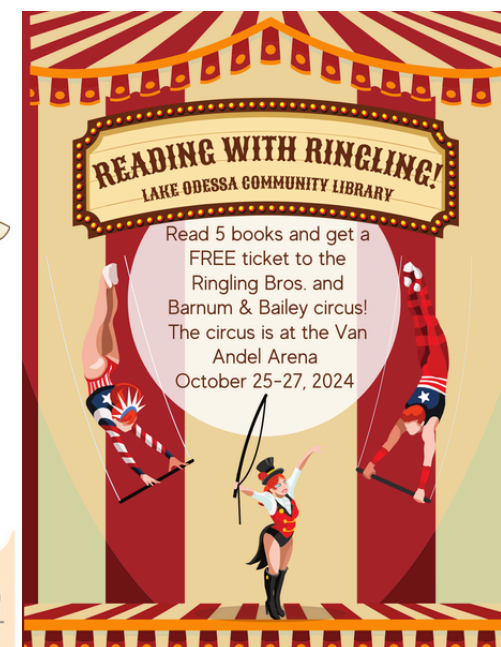

Need a library account?


- If you live in Odessa Township or Sebewa Township, scan the QR Code to apply for a library barcode.
