SUMMER BUSYNESS AT THE LIBRARY!

Library staff and volunteers collaborated with Feeding West Michigan's lunch program, Gather 2 Grow, to distribute a total of **2,190** lunches! Lunches were served daily from June through August, thanks to generous private donations from the West Michigan community.

The 2025 Summer Library Program, Color Our World, concluded its activities for preschoolers through teens, with **249** registrations! Out of these, **198** participants engaged in weekly programs, reading challenges, and various activities, leading to a remarkable total of **885** children attending **18** programs.

In July, **57** individuals registered for sewing classes, resulting in the completion of **165** projects across **21** classes. The sewing classes were fully sponsored by local grants from the PFCU Foundation, Retired Teachers of Ionia County, and The Friends of the Lake Odessa Library.

Every Friday in July, Mr. Mike hosted summer STEM activities at the beach, where **33** kids discovered the joys of STEM in a fun, outdoor setting under sunny skies.

During June, July, and August:

- 6,285 items were checked out.
- 6,068 items were checked in.
- Public computers were utilized **523** times, totaling **11,030** minutes of usage.
- 2,052 digital items were downloaded.
- Public wifi was used 4,263 times.
- 104 new patron accounts were created!






The God of the Woods by Liz Moore

It's August 1975 and a female summer camper has gone missing from her bunk. Her disappearance mirrors that of her older brother who went missing from their nearby home years earlier. This story intertwines various narratives including camp counselors and local townspeople; the children's wealthy parents and the police investigating both disappearances. These opposing viewpoints provide not only conflicting information about the missing children, but also reveal deep divisions in the community. A surprise ending brings the book to an unexpected conclusion.

The Mother Next Door by Andrea Dunlop and Mike Weber


"Munchhausen by proxy" is a little-known mental illness wherein caregivers (overwhelmingly mothers) cause sickness or disability in their children to garner attention and sympathy from others. (The news story of Gypsy Rose Blanchard is an example of this diagnosis.) This book recounts three separate cases that occurred in Texas in the mid-to-late 2000s. Author Weber was an investigator for the District Attorney office charged with gathering evidence against each of the mothers. Author Dunlop (whose own sister was accused of Munchhausen's) narrates Weber's fight to bring the women to justice and save their children. The accused mothers come from varying ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds with little in common other than the attempts to harm their children for emotional and psychological gain.






Class Clown: The Memoirs of a Professional Wiseass- How I went 77 Years Without Growing Up by Dave Berry

Best known as a humor columnist for the Miami Herald newspaper, Berry turns a comedic eye to his childhood and younger years. From his exploits as a boy in small Armonk, New York, to writing jokes for Steve Martin at the Academy Awards, Berry recounts how humor has been the mainstay of his life. Even through difficult periods (his father was a late life alcoholic and his mother committed suicide) Berry shares the lighthearted aspects of his numerous ups and downs, always maintaining that life is better when laughing.
