


Local Author Event May 3rd

RJ Erskine is a retired veterinarian who served for 30 years on the faculty at Michigan State University. In his suspense novels, he relies on personal experiences and events while practicing within an Amish community in Pennsylvania during the 1980s. His stories describe how a singular, rural community responds to crises brought about by both natural forces and human corruption. The author currently lives

in Michigan with his wife and assorted pets. His fourth novel is set to be released in early summer of 2025. As a new veterinarian whose clients were predominately Amish, RJ Erskine's life took a dark, chaotic twist when a rabies outbreak descended upon the community. In his novel, Casting Demons Into Swine, the author relied on actual events and personal experiences during his early years in practice. He blends history with fiction — seasoned with a touch of the supernatural — to write stories of suspense, set in a deceptively serene valley within the mountains of Pennsylvania.





Sandwich by Catherine Newman

Newman's latest release follows the narrator Rocky and her family over the span of a week while vacationing in Cape Cod. Rocky navigates her family's expectations of her and the multiple roles of wife, daughter and mother. During the vacation a long-buried secret is revealed and Rocky must decide how it affects not only her marriage but her own self-image. The title of the book references Rocky's often precarious place between her adult children and her aging parents, as well as the sandwiches she loving makes for her family's many trips to the local beach.





While Idaho Slept by Reuben Applebaum

The murders of four college students in November 2022 stunned the college community of Moscow, Idaho. Applebaum's book follows the case from the discovery of the bodies to the arrest of the suspect, Bryan Kohberger. The author explains the police procedures used to investigate, locate and charge Kohberger. He also introduces the reader to the four victims and the lives they were leading up until that fateful night. Currently the case is awaiting trial.

The Friday Afternoon Club by Griffin Dunne

Actor, producer and writer Dunne recounts his life in Los Angeles and New York amid Hollywood glamour and East Coast temptations. Born into a privileged family (his aunt was Joan Didion), Dunne's childhood was filled with famous names (friendships with JFK's nephew Peter Lawford and actress Carrie Fischer) and youthful indiscretions (at 14 years old he spent hours at a Beverly Hills party waiting impatiently for Janis Joplin to arrive.) In 1982 Dunne's younger sister, actress Dominique (Poltergeist), was murdered by a jealous exboyfriend. The family survived the trial only to see the murderer sentenced to a scant 3.5 years in prison. Dunne's father Dominick (formerly a television producer) found solace in writing and reinvented himself as a crime




reporter at Vanity Fair magazine. Dunne himself went on to star in and produce films (An American Werewolf in London, After Hours, Dallas Buyers Club.) He speaks of his family and those he met along his journey with both an objective eye and unwavering affection.


