

Author and Pulitzer Prize Winning journalist Edward Humes has turned his considerable talent to writing the book, *The Forever Witness: How DNA and Genealogy Solved a Cold Case Double Murder*. In November 1987, teenagers Jay Cook and Tanya Van Cuylenborg, were found murdered in rural Washington state. The couple agreed to travel from their homes in British Columbia, Canada via van to purchase furnace parts for Cook's father in Seattle. They never arrived at the furnace store and never checked in with their parents. About a week later, Van Cuylenborg's body was found, followed a few days later by Cook's in a different area. The murders went unsolved for over 3 decades until

a check of familial DNA websites (using residue left on Van Cuylenborg's body) led to the man suspected of the crimes. Hume's masterfully weaves the tale of law enforcement's refusal to give up on the case with the murders' tragic reverberations through the victims' families and community. Although many involved with the case have since died, (including Van Cuylenborg's father) Humes shows that even years later, justice can still be found and celebrated. (available as ebook)

Most of the public think they know the story of the British royal family and its members. Prince Harry, Duke of Sussex shows through his new book *Spare* there are always hidden misconceptions and falsehoods of public figures and their lives. *Spare* starts with the tragedy of 12-year old Harry losing his mother, Princess Diana in a 1997 Paris car crash and continues through the present day and the rift between Harry and his royal relatives. Throughout the memoir, Harry recounts how the paparazzi and media have stalked and harassed him all his life. He describes the fraught relationship with his father, King Charles and stepmother Camilla and most surprisingly, his intensely competitive bond with brother William, the Prince of



Wales. Many will find it difficult to have sympathy for Harry, growing up in a life of wealth and privilege, but his book shows money and fame do not diminish a person's grief or unhappiness. (available as hardcover book, ebook, audiobook)



I'm Glad My Mom Died by Jennette McCurdy is a surprise from the title through the final reading. McCurdy, who found fame as a child on the Nickelodeon show *iCarly*, recounts the influence her mother had over her and her television career. In turns supportive and dismissive; caring and cruel, McCurdy's mother insisted Jennette follow her edicts into the teen years and beyond, regarding such things as food (which led to an eating disorder) to how often Jennette should bathe. The most difficult parts of the book to read outline the sexually abusive behavior of Mrs. McCurdy toward Jennette

and one of her brothers. It is only upon the death of her mother in 2013 that Jennette finally breaks free of the control she experienced and forges ahead toward her own version of life. (available as hardcover book, ebook, audiobook)

LIFETIME MEMBER DISPLAY

This past December the Friends of the Library worked with Design Edge Sign Company to produce and install our Lifetime Member Display. Pictured are our Friends Co-chairs Heidi Reed and Dawn Deardorff who 'supervised' the installation. This project was spearheaded by former Friends Board Member Richard Stone before he moved out of state. The Friends had wanted to do a project like this to recognize lifetime members and Ric was able to get the momentum and design work moving forward. A few people wondered why their name was not included on the



display. Virtually all of those that inquired had contributed to the Library directly or for the Library's Remodel and Expansion. To become a Lifetime Friend Member is a one-time \$100 donation made payable to the Friends of the Lake Odessa Community Library. This payment can be mailed or dropped off to the Library. Annual updates will be made to the Lifetime Member Display.

FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY ANNUAL REPORT

Each year the Friends of the Library use donations and fundraising to support our public library. For the past year one of the ways we supported library patrons and the public was paying for printing, copies, and faxes — in our fiscal year that ended March 31, 2023, those costs amounted to **\$4,492.85**. Friends also volunteer and support the Library in other ways throughout the year. In the past year that meant:

- --distributing lunches for the Feeding America program with bottled water purchased by the Friends,
- --giving out maps for Christmas Round the Town, with donuts, cider, and coffee,
- --decorating the inside of the Library for Christmas and paying for the outside Christmas garlands,
- --helping Santa after the Christmas Parade with a variety of cookies for parade goers of all ages. The Friends also set aside **\$5,000** each year to pay for programs at the Library. The Friends want our Library programming to come at no cost to children and adults, although a refundable deposit may sometimes be required to sign up for a class. Friends Board Members also volunteered to help with programs as needed throughout the year. If funding is available, the Friends also help the Library pay for additional expenses. In the past year that meant painting in the meeting rooms and window and carpet cleaning. Plus, purchasing more lighting for the basement, a new coffee maker for the meeting

rooms, a new drinking fountain station with bottled water filler, and a bag of power tools for checkout at the Library.
