


the option to curate lists of books you've read, liked, disliked, and plan to read.


Holly by Stephen King


King once again masterfully draws in the reader with his latest tale of suspense and horror. The character of Holly Gibney was first introduced in King's Mr. Mercedes trilogy as a reluctant but determined private investigator. In this latest work, Gibney now owns her own PI firm and is hired to locate a young woman who has disappeared in a quiet college town. Her investigation finds other individuals who have also gone missing in recent years. The trail of evidence leads to an elderly married couple, retired professors from the local university. The couple's basement has turned into an abattoir of fear and death. King is at his best when showing that evil exists in the banality of everyday life and

everyday people. Who better to fool society (and police) than a harmless old couple? This book is worth the read not only for King's narrative but for the return of the character of Gibney. (Hardcover, ebook, audiobook, book on CD)

Bright Young Women by Jessica Knoll

This is a fictionized account of Ted Bundy's attack on the Chi Omega sorority house in 1978. The narrator is one of the surviving sorority sisters who recounts Bundy's murder of her friends. The book details how Bundy was romanticized by authorities and the press during his killing spree in the 1970's. He was portrayed as an intelligent and capable man even after being suspected of murder and rape. His victims however, remained nameless and often were blamed for placing themselves in his murderous path. Knoll's work is an indictment of sexism and misogyny that existed not only in the 70's but still today. (ebook, audiobook)





The Trap by Catherine Ryan Howard

This book is based on a series of unsolved disappearances of missing women in Ireland during the 1990's. The reader is witness to the attempts by a policewoman and a sister to find a missing woman. Fearful the young woman is the new victim of an unknown abductor it is a race against time to locate her. Told in alternating voices, including the male kidnapper, the novel has twists and turns not anticipated until the very end. Reading this book may also inspire you (as it did me) to further research the real-life disappearances in Ireland. (Libby audiobook)



FREE COPIES VERY POPULAR

For the past several years the Friends have covered the cost of up to 10 copies a day for library patrons — both color and black-and-white. If more than 10 copies needed the charge per page is 50 cents for color and 15 cents for black-and-white. In 2023 the Friends reimbursed the Library \$4,656.10 for copies. The Friends Board voted to continue this popular service for the 2024 calendar year. Also, the Library Board of Trustees voted to discontinue charging for faxes. Faxing is now free of charge. The Library also offers other services for nominal charges, like document lamination. Charges for lamination vary based on the size of the document.

WELCOME TO HOOPLA!

Hoopla lets you borrow audiobooks, ebooks, comics, movies, TV shows, magazines, and music. Up to 8 borrows a month are currently supported by our Library — and often hoopla offers weekly binge specials too! It's all FREE thanks to our Library. All you need is your library card. With hoopla you can stream titles immediately or when you are in the mood — anywhere you have a screen. Your computer, tablet, phone, even your TV! If you are not already using hoopla and want to get started ask a staff member for help. If you are interested in learning more about digital platforms our Library offers, let a staff member know.

FAMILY RESTROOMS AT THE LIBRARY

With a couple of new signs and some added locking mechanisms, the public bathrooms at the Library will soon be family restrooms instead of men's and women's restrooms. The Library staff believes it will be an asset to families and caregivers to use universal washrooms because this provides privacy and accessibility solutions.
